Haiti Orphan Prevention Effort
Hope for the future of Haiti by transforming
the lives of its vulnerable children.

On our mission trips to Haiti, our hearts have been broken by the poorest and most vulnerable of its people - the orphans.

We discovered that most of Haiti's "orphans" are actually abandoned children--given up to orphanages by their desperate mothers and fathers who can no longer afford to feed or clothe them.



The children want to stay with their families, but they are hungry and their future seems hopeless.



So HART is working with Fr. Louis, a dynamic young priest with a passionate love for the Lord, and Sister Nathalie who has felt God place in her heart the desire to help the little ones of Haiti learn of their great dignity and the love of God. And to keep these poor children in the embrace of their loving families!

We have started a program called **The Little Brothers and Sisters of Jesus**. Starting with 50 children, we will meet six afternoons per week. In addition to working with the families, the program will focus on four main areas of suffering of these children:

- **Spiritual** – through relational ministry with mentors to accompany the children, Fr. Louis hopes to contribute in raising up little Catholic missionary disciples of Jesus who can contribute to a new Haiti in the future.
- **Social** – many of the children grow up with much missing in their human formation, often because of poverty. Through mentors and supervised play, they will learn respect, selflessness, fair play and etiquette.
- **Intellectual** – the mentors will be tutors helping them with schoolwork and take an interest in their academic success.
- **Nutritional and Physical** – the children will be fed and cared for medically.
