Seeing children grow from anxious eaters to confident eaters, never going to church to making their first communion, and excelling academically makes every effort worthwhile."

When asked to share something fun about herself, Sister Nathalie reveals, "I love to dance!" She began dancing with the children and now finds it a joyful way to relax and momentarily escape the hardships of her country.
